

Oquirrh Mountain Charter School Dress Code

The purpose of this policy is to enhance the learning environment and cultivate an atmosphere of discipline, equality, and respect.

COLORS



Students may wear the items listed below. Anything not listed may *not* be worn. All clothing must...

- Be in good condition
- Fit properly

Shirts and Blouses

Polo's and turtlenecks – long or short sleeve:

- Allowed colors are solid white, navy blue, grey and burgundy.
- Long sleeve shirts may be worn underneath short sleeve polo's. Allowed colors are solid white, navy blue, grey and burgundy. Solid white undershirts may also be worn.
- Must remain buttoned except for the top button.
- If a shirt has a logo, it must be on the left breast and not be distracting in color or size as determined by the administration (no larger than 2"x2")

Oxfords and collared blouses – long or short sleeve:

- White only
 - Must remain buttoned except for the top button.
 - With the exception of the Polo Hem and grades K-2, all shirts must remain completely tucked in at all times.
 - Solid white undershirts may be worn. NO colored undergarments or tank tops allowed.
 - No undergarments should be visible through the shirt. *This includes colored undergarments.*

Pants, slacks, shorts, skirts, jumpers

- Allowed colors are solid Khaki (tan), navy blue, grey, or optional burgundy/grey school approved plaid. Top of garment shall remain at or above the waist. **Black pants are not allowed.** Garment shall be no shorter than 3" (index card) from top of knee cap.
- Styles
 - Pants/Capris – Uniform style. Top of garment shall remain at or above the waist.
 - Skirts/Skortis – No shorter than 3" (index card) from top of knee cap.
 - Jumpers – No shorter than 3" (index card) from top of knee cap.
- Fabric –twill, poly/cotton, or corduroy. (No denim or stretch fabric)

Belts

- Solid brown, black, or navy blue belts with non-decorative buckles. Belts must go through the belt loops.

Socks

- Socks are required; they must be solid white, navy blue, grey, black, or burgundy. Females may substitute natural-colored hose.
- No bright color, plaids, stripes, etc.
- Tights and leggings must be solid white, navy, grey or burgundy (No fishnet or big patterns)
 - Leggings must hit at ankle and meet with socks

Shoes

- Black, dark brown, navy blue, grey, burgundy, or white, closed toe, shoes are required.
- Shoes do not have to be solid in color, but must be as simple as possible. Shoes can have stripes and swooshes. If any part of the shoe has color present, it must be school colors only.
- No plaids, skulls, characters, slippers, crocs, etc.
- Bright colors are not permitted on any part of the shoe **including the soles.**
- Snow boots are allowed as weather dictates (non-distracting.)
- No distracting shoes or boots allowed
- Please help us keep our school attractive by finding shoes/boots with non-marking soles.
- **No bright colored laces, lights, glitter/metallic or roller shoe**

Sweaters, sweater/suit vests – Hoods are allowed on Knitted sweaters only, NO fur.

- Only solid colors are allowed – white, navy blue, grey or burgundy. A shirt or blouse, described above, must be worn underneath.
- Styles
 - Knitted cardigans, pullovers and vests
 - No ruffles, ties, large buttons, embellishments, etc. on sweaters.
- Sweaters may not be longer than the bottom of the pocket opening of the pants and the students' hands must be visible.
- Non-hooded fleece style jackets may be worn in the classrooms during the winter months. They must be school colors, Navy Blue, Grey, Burgundy.
- Hoodies are not allowed in classrooms, but may be worn outside for recess.

Blazers

- Solid Navy blue or Grey blazers are allowed.

Jewelry

If the teacher finds any jewelry distracting, the student maybe asked to remove it.

- Ties, crossties and scarves must be solid burgundy, grey, navy blue, or the school approved burgundy/grey plaid.
- Bracelets – A maximum of three non distracting bracelets may be worn. No bright colored gel bracelets.
- Necklaces – A maximum of two non distracting necklaces may be worn.
- Earrings – one pair of non distracting earrings.

Hair & Accessories

- Hair color must be natural shades, no bright colors.
- Hair accessories are permitted if in school colors and non-distracting.

Athletics

- **Cheerleaders**
 - Allowed to wear Sunday dress (school color appropriate) on game or competition day. Warm up jackets are allowed on Friday's only (no warm up pants).
- **Team Sports**
 - Boys are allowed to wear white button down shirts on game days, they may also wear tie's that are school colors and a suit if preferred.

- Girls are allowed to wear skirts as long as they are within dress code color.

Additional Restrictions

Outerwear, other than sweaters, must be stored in the students locker and only worn to and from outside. Headwear, including hats, bandanas, sunglasses, etc., is not allowed other than while transitioning during cold weather. Makeup that is distracting or inappropriate is not allowed. No sagging and bagging of clothes. No extreme hairstyles. Hair will be clean and neatly groomed. Hair paints or colored sprays are not permitted. Unfinished or frayed hems on skirts, jumpers, pants, shorts, or any article of clothing are not allowed.

Exceptions

- This policy shall be adhered to on the part of OMCS students unless an exception is approved by the Director.
- Fridays will be known as Spirit Days where students may wear shirts and sweatshirts with the "official" OMCS school logo or an "official" university logo (hoods are never allowed above the neck.) **NO NFL, NBA type of jersey allowed.**

*OMCS school approved plaid is a SPECIFIC plaid with burgundy, grey and white. To locate vendors that carry the approved plaid go to "Shopping for uniforms".

There will be opportunities for parents and students to purchase OMCS branded clothing throughout the school year.

OMCS dress code will be reviewed on a yearly basis. Any person wishing to submit ideas for the alterations to the current dress code policy will need to write a written proposal to dresscode@omcharterschool.org.

Students will receive a warning on the first dress code violation, parents will be called on the second violation, and students will receive ISS (in school suspension) on the third violation.
